Dear Friends, Family, and Churches,

Over the years I have developed an interest in Dr. David Livingstone, the Victorian era missionary and explorer. He lived in the 1800's but his influence is felt today. Near our home in Kigoma, Tanzania is the place where the American newspaper reporter Henry Stanley found Livingstone and said, "Dr. Livingstone I presume." In Zimbabwe David Livingstone's bronze statute looks out over Victoria Falls – which he discovered and named for his Queen. Claudia was mugged there. South Africa is where he spent his early missionary career. Our children were born there. In Zambia we drove past the place of his death. We spent that night on the Moffat family farm – descendants of Livingstone's in-laws. In London I have stood at his grave in Westminster Abbey among the kings and queens of the British Empire.

I decided to buy some books written by and about Livingstone and the major characters in his life. A quick search of the internet showed that some of the books can be very expensive. Some sell for more than \$4,000. They are treasures. On E-bay, an internet auction site, I located some of these old books in poor condition and within my budget. E-bay is something that I can do "only in America".

My collection of Africana books is slowly growing and so is my knowledge of Livingstone and his day. He was very human. Bitten by a lion on his arm, he was handicapped for the rest of his life. His personality made him a misfit and failure in many ways. Yet with God's help he accomplished so much. His witness and work for Christ was lasting. Some have credited England's anti-slavery laws directly to Livingstone's writings. There was something in this man that England felt reflected its best values and highest ideals.

Who will be God's next Livingstone? Who, despite weakness and failure, will God use to change Africa and the world in the 21<sup>st</sup> century? While visiting churches we look into the faces of the children. Am I seeing God's next "David Livingstone"? Will it be from among our children that the Lord of the harvest will call and enable a special person to change their world forever? Are we willing to pray that it may be so?


We are maintaining an update on what we have and what is needed. Check our website (“front burner”) or call 708-889-1315.

### QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

## Will You Be In Danger When You Go Back?

**Q. When you go back to Africa, will you be in danger if the US goes to war against Iraq?**

A. I cannot predict the future but right now I think it will be safe to return to Tanzania in June. We work at keeping ourselves well informed about political tensions and potential problems. The U.S. State Department sends us advisory warnings via email. We are registered with the American Embassy in Tanzania. More important, we keep close watch on local attitudes and sentiments.

We have friends in our area who are in possession of knowledge and information and they quietly advise us. We work hard to maintain friendships across all religious and political lines. It is simply wise to do these things. I

will not knowingly risk the lives of my loved ones. One of our potential guests asked me how they could tell if it was safe to come to Tanzania. I told him, “If you want my assessment, just see if I am there. I will not be there if I feel the risk level is too great.” All of that being said, we live in a dangerous world. Osama bin Laden blew up the American embassy in Tanzania. Political crisis, criminal activity, war and upheaval — we know our witness occurs in a context of human evil and tragedy. We go to Africa with faith in the living and powerful God, not in our circumstance. ✠
